Dr. Sean Kivlehan, PGY4, received the Teaching Excellence Award for Cherished Housestaff (T.E.A.C.H.) from the UCSF School of Medicine Class of 2015. Each year the graduating medical school class presents this award to five residents who have been outstanding teachers, mentors and role models to

medical students during their clinical years at UCSF. There will be a reception at the Nobel Wall on Thursday, May 14, 2015, at 11:00 am followed by the SOM Convocation ceremony at noon in Cole Hall where he will be presented with the award.

Annual CME Course

The University of California San Francisco-Fresno Department of Emergency Medicine will host the <u>High Sierra Wilderness and Travel Medicine Conference</u> on April 29-May 1 at Bass Lake. The conference is

designed to meet the needs of those who may encounter life-threatening situations with limited resources. Through both lecture and skills workshops, explore topics including survival and field treatment of environmental illness, rescue techniques, and lessons learned from medical delivery in austere settings ranging from the Alaskan wilderness to the large Western National Parks.
